#### 5. Committee and Event Reports

A. Trunk or Treat/Trail of Treats 10/26 (Caryn Walker and Terri Fiorenzi)
We're trying a new location this year: the walking path
Still looking for people to host tables or canopies on the trail
Let us know if you'd like a vendor table for your business

#### Caryn:

- Setup starts at 4:30pm
- Pumpkin drop-off is between 8:30-3:30pm on the grassy alcove near the back parking lot. Will use the same signs from last year
- Might use LED rope lights to possibly mark the path from trunks to canopies? Since we don't have enough canopies, maybe cancel the trunk spots?
- How do we limit multiple pass throughs? Have a 2<sup>nd</sup> line for additional passes? Dance party with Ms. Rogge?
- Caryn will call the Fire and Police Departments to see if they can participate. They will need to park in drop off loop
- Will ask Jen to help bring music (Kristin)
- We need more volunteers. Caryn will create a sign-up genius so Nikki can send to NHS
- Staff Booth 10-12 planning on coming but many want to walk around with their kids. The rest could either be at a booth or help volunteer where needed
- Do not need to request bathroom access, we haven't used it in the past.

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Read-a-thon and Movie Night Recap (Carmen McAlister)
 \$22,715 kept \$21,285.25, kept 94% of what we made
 376 kids registered (~75%), 239 raised funds, 348 logged minutes
 Beat our reading minute goal: 106,643

- Based on the sign-in, 388 attended the event. There's a good chance it was more as many people walked by the sign-in tent.
   We had 470 RSVP so most likely with was somewhere between 388 and 470 attendees
- Students were really excited for it
- Face paint was very popular and consistently had a long line
- Approximately 340 bags of popcorn were handed out/sold
- Sold out of Hot Chocolate

388 people signed in at movie night

- Sold 2 boxes of glow wands
- Reminder for teachers to spend the \$200 winnings for the top grade (Carmen will email)
- Magnets were a very popular prize, especially in upper grade levels
- B. Book Fair (Emily Reigle and Stephanie Narry)
  Previews begin Friday, shopping is next week
  Be on the lookout for your student's wish list
  eWallet is available again this year

• Big Top Circus Theme

- Staff had preview day today. Student shopping will run from Monday 10/17-Friday 1-21. Shopping is also available to parents during conferences from 4:30-7:30pm
- We have 35 volunteers this year!
- Usually we sell about \$12,000, with 50% of that coming back to the school for book funds
- This is a great opportunity to shop for Christmas presents
- · We accept cash, check, credit card, and eWallet
- Teachers all have an eWallet that parents can donate to for classroom books
- C. 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Committee (Stephanie Narry)

5<sup>th</sup> graders are scheduled for 2 camps this year. They also can take an additional field trip. BNC provides \$800 towards field trips for each grade. If the 5<sup>th</sup> graders opt to not have an additional trip, those funds can go toward the camp payments. Mrs. Sanders will follow up with teachers to see what they want to do

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- Little Cesars fundraiser is in January and 5<sup>th</sup> graders can be named to earn additional funds for camp.
  - 1. This should also be a fundraiser for 4<sup>th</sup> graders to help set them up for their first 5<sup>th</sup> grade camp in the fall. The first camp payment is due mid-September
- Also, we will be starting \$1 hat days for students. These fundraisers will go toward 5<sup>th</sup> grade camp and will be on 1-2 Fridays per month. Students can wear a hat to school and pay \$1.
   Stephanie will collect money from teachers.
- Considering selling flowers for concerts
- Spring camp is tentatively May 11<sup>th</sup>
- Spring Willow sales can also have a 4<sup>th</sup> grader named to earn funds for the following year
- Busch's can list student names as well
- In January, we will start advertising for 4<sup>th</sup> grade parents to help with committee (5<sup>th</sup> grade breakfast, help keep track of funds earned for 4<sup>th</sup> graders)
- D. Rollerama (Jenny Stephan)
  - Wednesday, November 16<sup>th</sup> from 6-8pm
  - \$9 per skater, includes skate rental and 2 hours of skating. Students can bring their own skates
  - \$5 to rent skate trainers. Parents can wear their shoes to help
  - Concessions and arcade not included and are separate cost
  - Prepay via Toolkit to register. Rollerama did not want to run out of trainers, so those rentals need to be purchased onsite.
  - Storefront will open 11/1-11/13
