Purchases this month included Parent Teacher Conference dinners, den shirts, and card stock. We made a deposit for the 5th grade field trip to Camp Copneconic.

Deposits were added from the Mabel's Labels fundraiser, Busch's, and a check from CD Orthodontics to go toward the purchase of books for One Read.

4. Principal and Teacher's Report (Stacy Cooper)

The teachers appreciated the dinners purchased during Parent Teacher Conferences. Thank you also from the special education team for items purchased for the sensory room.

Mrs. Cooper expressed appreciation for the conference dinners and also the recent Scholastic Book Fair and Trail of Treats.

A previous BNC-PTO purchased Buddy Benches for the playground years ago, and those benches are now in need of painting. We discussed waiting until spring and power washing the benches first. We could possibly ask the Student Council or Girls on the Run if they'd like to paint the benches as part of a service project. We still have paint left over from when we painted the walking path a couple of years ago. We will need to follow up on this in the future.

5. Committee and Event Reports

 - Track shirts The shirts have been ordered, but we have not received them yet.
 - Ghost grams Recap -
 - Sold about 1300

- After expenses, profit was \$1056.02, which is \$14.08/student
- 47 Ghost Grams paid for out of profits
- Delivered to students end of day on Halloween in brown, labeled paper bag.

The kids really loved the Ghost Grams and overall it was very successful. A lot of parents purchased suckers for the whole class. The event went smoothly and it was good to have it outside of the cafeteria. We would consider doing this again, and discussed having a similar fundraiser at a different holiday (such as Valentine's Day). In the future, it would be best to have more help assembling the suckers, such as 5th grade helpers. It was also beneficial that each student's suckers were delivered at the end of the day in brown paper bags, so the students could not see how many suckers everyone received.

Caryn Walker was one of the parents who planned and sold the Ghost Grams. She was unable to attend this meeting, but offered feedback via email prior to the meeting. She noted that they won't be using personal accounts for payment next time (to save money on BNC fees and maximize fundraiser profits, and also to accommodate parents who do not have PayPal). In the future, it would be great if we could find a way to avoid the BNC PayPal fees. Using Zelle may be a cheaper option in the future.

B. Book Fair Recap (Stephanie)

The Scholastic Book Fair was a success. We sold approximately 2,050 books! Using Scholastic dollars, all staff were able to add \$50 worth of books to their classroom/office libraries. Additionally, teachers, Reading Recovery, and resource staff were able to add \$200 in supplies. The library ordered \$1,000 in books from the Scholastic Dollars Catalog with profits from our Spring 2023 book fair. Students who participated in the summer reading program and returned their books received a voucher to purchase a book costing \$10 or less.

Looking forward to the spring book fair, we would tentatively like to have the teacher preview on 3/7/24, and student shopping the week of 3/11/24. We are also hoping to host another Family Literacy Night on Wednesday 3/13. Mrs. Cooper will double check the dates to confirm they will work.

The book for One Read in March has been approved. It will be Beatrice Zinker Upside Down Thinker. The author is local, and Leslee Voss is working to arrange an author visit. We may be purchasing the books through 2 Dandelions bookstore. The book is the first in a three-book series, so if students enjoy this book they may want to read the other two. CD Orthodontics has donated \$1,000 toward the purchase of the books.

C. Trail of Treats 10/25 (Kristin)

- 16 decorated booths 4 businesses, 1 staff, 11 volunteers
- Approximately 400 trick or treaters
- Candy Monster brought in 4,239 pieces of candy
- PTO purchased additional for total of 8,129 pieces (500 per station)

We had a good turnout and the event well! We are hoping for more stations next year. We are open to ideas for ways to recruit more families and businesses to decorate booths.

The orders are slowly trickling in. We should promote more on Facebook and possibly send a flier home with students.

- **E.** Holiday Shop 12/4 12/8
 - Set up 12/4 with shopping 12/5 12/7. Make-up day 12/8. There will not be a preview day this year.
 - Flyers were sent home Monday 11/6. Shopping envelopes will be sent home as it gets closer
 - Sign-up genius for volunteers and staff have been sent out
 - Vouchers pending student count Students who qualify for free and reduced lunch can get a voucher toward the holiday gift shop, probably in the amount of \$5 per student. There is a new privacy law, which is creating some confusion, logistically. We are hoping to give the vouchers to the building social workers, who can distribute the vouchers to the appropriate students, so that BNC members will not have access to those student's names. There are 96 students who currently qualify. Mrs. Cooper agreed to look into the new privacy law and figure out the logistical piece.
- F. Downtown Shopping Night 12/7 -

We are working with several downtown businesses this year, including The Grande Trunke, The Lemon Tree, Coral Sash, and Venue. We discussed asking more businesses to participate, such as the Twisted Cork or MI Locker Room.
