3. Officers' Reports

- A. President's Report (Kristin Lowell)
- B. Treasurer's Report (Nikki Orton)
 - This month's income and expenses
 Expenses since the last meeting include: a Biggby barista visit for staff, a staff wellness bar, and school supplies restock. Most teachers still have their \$200 allocations; Michele Sanders will send a reminder. We paid Snowy Owl for the last Bobcat Bash. We have had income from our upcoming Painted Croc fundraiser coming in.

4. Principal and Teacher's Report (Stacy Cooper)

Brummer will be getting a therapy dog! It is a female chocolate lab, and the dog will be trained extensively, with the expectation that it will be joining Brummer for the 2025-26 school year. The student council and teacher leaders are working out how to name the dog. There are donors and sponsorships that paid for the dog, its training, vet bills, food, and so forth. It is customary for the PTO to retain a line item in the budget for \$1000 for care of the dog, to include things like harnesses and beds. This would need to be added to the budget when we get the dog, so keep in mind for the future. Bartlett Elementary will be getting a therapy dog at the same time and there will be a joint photo op on 2/29. They would like a PTO representative there for the photo op.

The Kindergarten/JK informational event was on 1/25/24, and 51 families filled out the intent to enroll, which is fewer than normal. The Kindergarten meet and greet is being moved from August back to May (it was previously in May) during the school day. This is to allow for staff to have more time to interact with incoming students, and because August already has a lot of events, which is difficult for families. The meet and greet is set for May 23rd.

Professional Development Day was moved to 2/27 by the district so there is no school for students that day. Staff will be using some of that day to work on plans for implementing PBIS.

We are getting new cafeteria tables, which are supposed to be delivered tomorrow after lunch.

Jillian Smith and Michele Sanders would like to thank the BNC for the coffee (barista visit) in December and for the school supply restock.

 - Shops were open on 12/7 from 4-7pm and donate a percentage of sales back to Brummer Grande Trunke, Lemon Tree, Venue, Coral Sash, Twisted Cork

- Earned \$452.83 Grande Trunke \$232.83, Coral Sash \$150 (only had 2 shoppers so it was mainly a donation), Twisted Cork \$45, Venue \$25.

- C. Candy Cane Lane (Danielle)
 - 15 orders, earning \$294 (after expenses) This went off really well for a first time fundraiser, and we are hopeful that more people will participate next year.
- D. Airborne Fundraiser (Kristin)
 - Had a total of 52 online tickets and 9 in park tickets purchased, earning \$296
- E. Little Caesar's Pizza Kits (Kristin)
 - Pickup was 2/5 at Brummer
 - Sold 305 kits, earning a total profit of \$1830
 - 5th Graders \$354
 - Delivery Fee \$30
 - BNC \$1446
- F. Painted Croc Fundraiser (Kristin)
 - Registration open until 2/11
 - Painting will be held in the cafeteria on 2/28 from 5:30-7:30pm
 - Alena from the Painted Croc will bring all items purchased as well as the supplies needed to paint. She will take completed projects back to her studio to fire in the kiln and return them back to Brummer for pickup
 - Pre-registration is required, walkups are not permitted as the items are ordered in advance
 - BNC earns \$3 per item purchased and \$4 per item if over 100 are sold
- G. 5th Grade Valentine Fundraiser (Nikki)
 - Sales are 2/7-2/9 outside the cafeteria, and will be delivered to class on 2/14.
 - BNC will purchase any extra to ensure all students receive one

There have been a lot of parents who have purchased Valentines for the whole class. This means that expenses are already covered, and we have already made \$400 profit so far for the 5th graders. All future sales will go toward profit.

Stephanie and Joanne have started putting up book fair decor! The theme is "Dare to be ..." (Dare to be Different, Dare to be You), to go along with our One School, One Read book (Beatrice Zinker, Upside Down

Thinker). For Literacy Night, the food trucks will arrive after dismissal and be ready to take orders by 5 p.m. Inside events should start around 5:30. There is an author/illustrator named Ruth Barshaw McNally, who writes the Ellie McDoodle books, scheduled as a guest at Literacy Night. Last year's author visit was "drop in" style, which was distracting for the author. This year we will have two "sessions" so students and families can come in for set periods of time to participate in an activity with the author. We are hoping to have a raffle for books by our guest author. This may be tricky because the books are currently out of print, so we need to figure out how to get them. Last year, there was confusion during Literacy Night because families entered from the front door and the back near the Purple Hall, so not everyone knew about the punch cards and different stations. This year we will have signs posted at both entrances. Stations will also be more spread out to help ease congestion in the main hallway.

- J. Calendar Raffle (Nikki)
 - Tickets will be sold during the month of March
 - Each day in April has a certain prize associated with it. A ticket will be drawn each day, and the winner receives the prize for that day.
 - Donation updates We have about 30 donations received, with additional donations pending or in the mail. There are definitely enough donations to cover the entire month of April. Some will be paired together. Raffle tickets will be sold for \$20 each or possibly 5 for \$90.

6. Unfinished/Old Business

A. Buddy Benches - Student Council is interested in helping refinish the buddy benches in the spring. The specific details of that project are pending. The BNC is interested in purchasing a plaque for one of the buddy benches, dedicating it to Lisa Post's son Caleb, who passed away from childhood cancer last month. Some teachers have also expressed interest in doing that.

 - Non-HomesteadOperatingMillageRenewal&RestorationElection2024
 - Voting is Tuesday 2/27
 - Has a direct impact on the per pupil foundation allowance that the district receives from the State of Michigan.
 - If approved, the non-homestead operating millage would result in no increase in taxes to primary homestead homeowners.
 - if approved, would maintain an estimated \$15 million for the general operations of the school district in 2025.
 - If the operating millage renewal fails and is not available to levy in 2025, every operation of the school district would be closely analyzed in order to cut from the future budget to account for the loss in revenue.

Lisa Kudwa was present for the beginning of the meeting and presented facts about the upcoming millage. She allowed for questions and distributed a fact sheet about the proposed millage renewal.

C. Breakfast With Your Bobcat - We do not have budgeted funds for that this year. If the Calendar Raffle raises enough funds, we may be able to do it. Margaret Pierce coordinated that event
